I was thankfully able to get something interesting to me approved so now my title is "Allusions to the Old Testament in the Gospel of John: A Case Study of the King James Bible." I hope that when I am gone, this paper will remain a witness for those that choose to read it. In a sense, it will be a 30-page Gospel tract written along the lines of a lexicology research paper.

Pray please for us in Ukraine. The government has declared that the country will return to previous restrictions now that all of the major national holidays are over and we approach national elections. Of course, we hope that the situation of many with Covid will improve. In other news, new religious law amendments come into effect on October 3rd in Russia. These new regulations further muddle the restrictions on religious work, but they also make provisions for more immediate responses from the government concerning confirmation of notices given of religious activity - the absence of which has been used in prior prosecutions. In other words, the restrictions have gotten tighter, but the bureaucracy has been cut.

As I type this, I am thinking of what we read tonight in family devotions, particularly when Jesus said, "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Take therefore no thought for the morrow..."
