As we approached the exit, the light went on but we could see the gas station. As we fueled up, our stomachs (including Vivian's) started getting hungry so we needed to find somewhere to eat soon. Only thirty seconds away was a Steak & Shake so we parked and went inside. As we opened the door into the restaurant, my ears picked up the words "missions trip" from the cashier. As the cashier came by our table, we struck up a conversation with her and gave her a prayer card. She was so excited about what the Lord was doing for us and with us that she gave us what was probably her entire tips for the night which totaled thirty-five dollars! What was also excited to us was that on her break she sat down with us and wanted to know more about the need in Russia and Ukraine - and what our plans are for reaching them. Every cashier and waitress that we talked to after that made comment about how excited they were too for us and wished us well in our missionary endeavors.

God is unbelievably awesome. Perhaps, Elijah's acquaintances had their doubts when he told them how ravens had airlifted meat and bread to him, but the wizened prophet never forgot it.


Again we were blessed to be part of another church's camp week.
